


About the Center for Collaborative Partnerships in Aging

The **Ohio Department of Aging** is the designated State Unit on Aging, as required by the Federal Older Americans Act. It is a cabinet-level state agency with a director appointed by the governor. The agency receives and administers funding from a variety of state and federal sources. The ultimate vision for the Department is for Ohio to be on the leading edge of innovation and responsiveness to the growing and changing older population.

The **Ohio Association for Gerontology and Education** is a membership organization of educators, researchers, practitioners, and students in Ohio. The organization promotes gerontological education, supports Ohio's aging network as a resource for research and practice, and provides professional development for students, faculty and professionals. OAGE is committed to maintaining close working relationships with the Ohio Department of Aging, the state's area agencies on aging, Ohio's post-secondary institutions and all professional organizations and individuals in the aging network. OAGE serves as the official technical advisory body of the Department on issues of education, training and research in aging.

The Department has partnered with the Association to create the Center for Collaborative Partnerships in Aging. Hosted by the Department, the center provides interns of all ages and backgrounds with the opportunity to learn and contribute to policy-making firsthand, establish career-long professional contacts and gain valuable career knowledge and skills. The program is offered on a regular basis throughout the year. Students of all academic majors are eligible to participate. The Center also includes opportunities for those who are not currently in an academic degree program, but wish to apply their talents in the field of aging.

There are four types of internships offered:

To provide flexibility and ongoing experiences for our interns, the Department offers four types of internships:

- *Observational*: Gain a basic understanding of the type of work that the Ohio Department of Aging does on a regular basis.
- *Division Driven*: Learn while working with staff within one of the Department's divisions.
- *Department Driven*: Learn while working across divisions to look at the inner workings of the Department as a whole..
- *Civic Engagement Projects*: Complete one specific project that increases awareness and replication of practices that meet local needs while engaging Ohioans age 50+ in employment, community service and lifelong learning.

Interns have the opportunity to transition between internship types to accommodate their scheduling needs. The Department encourages interns to engage in multiple internship types to ensure they get a well-rounded overall experience in the field of aging and age related policy.
